Identifica las ventajas y desventajas del uso de la tecnología.	<p>This lesson begins with a warm greeting and welcome, along with informing students about the start of the 4th term.</p> <p>Students regularly recite a motivational phrase that embodies each school term, such as the one for the fourth term, as part of their routine.</p> <p><i>Dream big, work hard, and finish strong!</i></p> <p><i>The last term is here, let's end this year with joy and success!</i></p> <p>D. 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	<p>as well as a “Class Survey” which the teacher models:</p> <p><i>I watch TV every day.</i></p> <p><i>I plan my class on my computer.</i></p> <p>Then he asks questions to the students to elicit responses, following the example above.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do you play video games? → “Yes, I do / No, I don’t.”• Do you listen to music? → “Yes, I do / No, I don’t.” <p>The lesson keeps going with a support video for the lesson, which integrates vocabulary and related examples.</p> <p>Learn Technology Words for Kids Fun Tech Vocabulary in English!</p> <p>After that, the students write some technology-related activities that they do. They also draw themselves doing one of the activities.</p> <p>In addition, a practice speaking activity, “Technology Role Play,” is conducted where students present short dialogues to the class in pairs, considering the example below:</p> <p>A: What do you do with your phone? <i>B: I send messages.</i></p> <p>A: What do you do with your computer? <i>B: I play games.</i></p> <p>To conclude the lesson, the class as a whole does a reflection and shares responses answering questions like:</p> <p><i>What technology activity do you like the most?</i> <i>What activity do you do every day?</i></p>

Finally, they dive into a fun game, “True or False Tech”. The teacher says sentences, and they say whether it is true or false to reinforce comprehension, correct mistakes in a fun way, and consolidate the lesson.</p> <p>“I take photos with the TV.” (False) – students correct: “With the phone!”</p> <p>“I play video games with a console.” (True)</p> <p>I. The class commences with a warm greeting and welcome. Then, students recite a motivational phrase that embodies the fourth school term as part of their routine.</p> <p><i>Dream big, work hard, and finish strong!</i> <i>The last term is here, let's end this year with joy and success!</i></p> <p>D. Usage:

- Express impersonal obligation
- The subject is obliged or forced to act by a separate, external power (for example, the Law or school rules)
- Express objective obligation

Examples:

- *I **have to** leave early today.*

Giving Orders

- Come here now!
- Sit down!
- Line up immediately!
- Be quiet!
- Listen to me!

Giving Instructions

- Take a rest twice a day.
- Open your book on page 10.
- Read the passage carefully.

Giving Warnings

- Do not stand under the tree. There is lightning.
- Do not smoke. It is bad for your health.
- Do not drive too fast. The road is icy.

Giving Advice

- Study hard and you will pass the exam.
- Eat vegetables as part of a healthy diet.
- Exercise at least three times a week.

After that, the teacher conducts an activity, "*Listening & Speaking: Classroom Rules Role Play.*" He models:

-*We have to keep the classroom clean.*

-*Don't shout!*

And students repeat with gestures.

Therefore, in pairs, students invent 2 rules for the classroom (one with have to and one with an imperative) by following the teacher's sample.

Once they are done with the previous assessment, they continue with an activity, "*My Rule Poster.*"



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Students choose one negative action and write a rule to stop it.

Example:

Picture of someone littering:



Sentence:

Don't throw trash. We have to recycle.

They draw and decorate a small poster with their rules.

Besides that, the whole class gets into another captivating and funny game activity, “Act it Out!”

The teacher or a student mimes an action, for example: (shouting, or littering, etc). The class responds with a rule:

“Don't shout!” or “You have to be quiet.”

The teacher guides a reflection time:

-What bad actions should we stop?

-What rules help us live together?

Students share one sentence with *have to* or an imperative.



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		<p>C. Eventually, the teacher gives commands and the students answer, “Yes, Teacher!” “Don’t run!” - students stop. “Pick up your pencil!” - students do it.</p>		
3°A: 3°B:	DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES Identifica palabras y expresiones sencillas en inglés relacionadas con sus deberes en la casa, la escuela y la comunidad.	<p>I. The class begins with a warm greeting and welcome. Then, students say some motivational phrases that represent each school term, such as in the case of the fourth school term, which is the current one.</p> <p><i>“Dream big, work hard, and finish strong! The last term is here, let’s end this year with joy and success!”</i></p> <p>D. Later, they are provided with the class objectives based on the topic (<i>Duties and responsibilities</i>), which they are expected to achieve at the end of the lesson.</p> <p>On top of that, the teacher shares a meaningful and suitable definition of Duties and responsibilities focused on different contexts: at the school, home, and community. They also have examples for each, including the key vocabulary.</p>	School supplies Laptop PowerPoint presentation.	Participación Concentración y atención en clase.



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Therefore, the class continues with a warm-up that focuses on the question *What do you have to do?* and students are encouraged to give answers.


Besides that, the teacher shows through a PowerPoint presentation some duties and responsibilities, like the examples above:



Brush my teeth.



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Tidy up my bedroom.

Clean my room.

Once the presentation is finished, the teacher proceeds to watch a video that reinforces the lesson and also relates real life examples.

Subsequently, students do a speaking practice guided by the teacher, where students use the verb **Have to**, to express duties and responsibilities in different contexts (*School and Home*).

Example:

At home, I have to clean my room.

At school, we have to listen to the teacher.



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3°A: 3°B:	COMMON DISEASES AND SYMPTOMS. Comprende y describe algunos detalles en textos cortos y sencillos sobre temas familiares, a partir de imágenes y frases conocidas.	<p>Eventually, we continue with a Responsibility Circle activity. Students stand in a circle. Each says one responsibility they have.</p> <p><i>Example:</i> I have to brush my teeth → next student: I have to do my homework... until all participate.</p> <p>C. Lesson wraps up with the following question: Why are duties and responsibilities important?</p> <p>Expected answers: <i>Because they help us live better, keep things clean, and respect others.</i></p> <p><i>Assessment:</i> Draw a picture of one duty at home, one at school, and one in the community. Write a sentence for each: <i>I have to...</i></p> <p><i>Games:</i> https://wordwall.net/es/resource/31587923/duties-and-responsibilities</p>	School supplies Laptop PowerPoint	Participación Concentración y atención en clase.

D. Subsequently, the class continues with an introductory activity as it's a warm-up that introduces the main topic.

The teacher asks students, "How do you feel"? meanwhile, he acts out a symptom (coughing, sneezing, headache). Students guess what he is trying to mean through the mimic, and they might say, "You have a cold!"

In that way, the teacher introduces the topic by saying *"Today we will learn about diseases and symptoms."*

Students are given a suitable definition of what common diseases and symptoms are, including a key vocabulary list.

After that, students express theirs.

Besides that, they watch a video that supports the lesson.

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3°A: 3°B:	<p>POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES</p> <p>Comprende y describe algunos detalles en textos cortos y sencillos sobre temas familiares, a partir de imágenes y frases conocidas.</p> <p><i>Once the video is finished, the teacher asks some questions to review the vocabulary from the video. Then, they draw and write about themselves or someone sick in their family, or their favorite cartoon.</i></p> <p><i>Example:</i> <i>“Mickey has a toothache.”</i></p> <p>C. Eventually, the lesson ends with questions like:</p> <p><i>What diseases do you know?</i> <i>What should we do when we are sick?</i></p> <p>Expected answers: <i>Go to the doctor, stay at home, rest, drink water.</i></p> <p>I. The class begins with a warm greeting and welcome. Then, students say some motivational phrases that represent each school term, such as in the case of the fourth school term, which is the current one ongoing.</p> <p>“Dream big, work hard, and finish strong! <i>The last term is here, let’s end this year with joy and success!”</i></p> <p>D.
