This class starts by greeting the students warmly and welcoming them to the third term of the school year, also providing them with a motivational quote that they will shout out every class.</p> <p>“Believe in yourself and all that you are. Know that there is something inside you that is greater than any obstacle.”</p> <p>D. To introduce the topics to discuss in this section, the teacher opens the class with a warm up activity “Mine the Hobby”, therefore he mimics a hobby, for example: <i>Playing soccer, reading a book, and so for</i>) and students guess: <i>“You play soccer!”, “You read books!”</i> Then, invite volunteers to mime one.</p> <p>The teacher explains beforehand what a hobby is and also asks the students the following question: <i>What hobbies do you like?</i> To elicit responses, he gives examples first to guide the students, as they must use the present simple.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>I play the guitar.</i>• <i>I like dancing.</i>	School supplies Laptop PowerPoint presentation	Participación Concentración y atención en clase

After that, the teacher displays a list of hobbies using a PowerPoint presentation and provides it to the students.





Additionally, the teacher explains the structure that uses the present simple to express hobbies, along with examples.

Later, the teacher conducts an activity “Match the hobby” from which students receive a worksheet with two columns:

- A) Pictures of people doing hobbies
- B) Sentences in the Present Simple with some blanks to fill out.

They get a mini-questionnaire and walk around the classroom and ask classmates the questions in it to report to the class.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do you play a sport?• Do you read books?• Do you ride a bike?• Do you dance? <p>C. To wrap up the lesson, each student draws or pastes a picture of their favorite hobby and writes 2-3 sentences (including one family member) using the Present Simple and present their poster briefly. Example: <i>My favorite hobby is drawing. I draw every day. My brother plays the guitar.</i></p>

Once they finish the previous activity, students draw their own object and describe it with 2 adjectives.

C. **“My Crazy Classroom”** students describe their classroom, real or imaginary.

Example:

There is a big desk, a soft chair, and a colorful board.

To conclude and review the lesson, the whole class plays **Adjective Detective**.

The teacher describes something using **two adjectives** only.

Later, the teacher emphasizes the national celebrations, considering when and where they are held.

Examples:

- The National Beauty Pageant – held in Cartagena in November
- Black and White Carnival – held in Pasto, on January 5th to 6th
- The Flower Fair – held in Medellin in August

Besides that, the teacher clarifies that when talking about an event or celebration date, cardinal numbers are crucial.

We say:
✓ **Fourth of July**
and not
✗ **Four of July**

C. Therefore, each student mentions a celebration they like most and the date it takes place; finally, the teacher asks for birthday dates.

Example:

I like the Flower Fair held in Medellin in August. Besides that, my birthday is on July 4th.
